# Poland

## Geography

Poland is a central European state, bordering Germany to the west, the Czech Republic to the south-west, Slovakia to the south, Ukraine to the east-south-east and Belarus to the east-north-east, and the Russian enclave of Kaliningrad and Lithuania to the north-east. It is a parliamentary republic whose national currency is the złoty. It has been a member of the European Union since 1 May 2004.



It is ranked 9e in terms of European surface area. By way of comparison, its number of km<sup>2</sup> is around two-thirds that of France or Spain, roughly equivalent to that of Germany and slightly greater than that of Italy or the United Kingdom. We have therefore assumed a number of natachas of between 250 and 500 units.

Let's take a look at the topographical map to see how densely populated the country is.



Poland has 70 peaks over 1,000 metres high.

The Tatras are the highest mountain range in Poland and the Carpathians. They are located in the extreme south of the country. This is where Poland's highest peak, the Rysy (2,499.6 metres), is located. At the foot of this mountain lies Lake Morskie Oko ("Eye of the Sea"), considered to be one of the most beautiful lakes in the world.

Other mountain ranges in Poland include :

The Beskids, whose highest mountain is Babia Góra (1,725 meters);

The Karkonosze with its Śnieżka mountain (1,602 meters).

The Three Crowns massif in the Piénines.

Les Gorce, whose highest point is Turbacz (1,310 meters);

The Pienines, whose highest mountain is Wysoka (1,050 meters);

The highest peak in the Bieszczady, in south-east Poland, is Tarnica (en) (1,346 meters).



This relief is essentially pronounced in the south and very little in the north. As in many other European countries, the north will not produce europoints of great value, whereas the south will produce many. The problem is that we are not dealing here with the surface area of a small territory but of a large country. We had to deal with apples and pears, with numerous climbs below 5% making the challenge survive painfully in the immense flat areas of the north, while in the south, the swarming walls had to pass through a demanding selection sieve.

The country's reputation for tourism and the well-known Tour of Poland, which is included in the World Tour of the biggest races for professionals, are two arguments which also fuel the need for a large number of natachas. However, we're not talking here about the same aura as the 3 major tours, each of which grants 800 summits to France, Italy and Spain, and the less important races exist without being very numerous. All in all, we've come up with 400 natachas.

Poland also has two major rivers flowing into the Baltic Sea. The Vistula, 1,047 km long, flows through several major Polish cities, including the capital, Warsaw. The Oder, 854 km long, forms part of the border between Germany and Poland. The country also has some major rivers, such as the Warta, a tributary of the Oder 808 km long, and the Bug, a tributary of the Vistula 772 km long. These rivers will provide a large number of climbs through the hills that form their banks.





## The sporting side of Polish climbs


The Polish terrain means that there are long, very low gradient sections in the north and short, very high gradient sections in the south. You won't find many Alpine or Pyrenean-style climbs in Poland. In mountainous areas, the high gradients are numerous and striking.

There are only 49 slopes more than 10 kilometres to the south, but 75 slopes with a bomb, including 23 with an average percentage greater than 10% and 22 with a maximum hectometric percentage greater than 20%. That's a lot!

In contrast, to the north, there are 85 slopes with an average gradient of less than 2%. This section already includes climbs in the Baltic States and Scandinavia, apart from the Fjords. Principle no. 1 of complete geographical representativeness has led us to include climbs of this kind. Each time, we try to make sure that these long false flats are attractive to tourists, have an original surface or are venues for national cycling races.



## Polish cycle races

### A country of great riders

Poland is a cycling country.

The recent victory of the current Polish queen of cycling, *Katarzyna "Kasia" Niewiadoma*, in the women's Tour de France in 2024 is proof of this.

*Michał Kwiatkowski* was world champion in 2014 and winner of classics such as Milan-San Remo, the Amstel Gold Race or the Strade Bianche.

*Zenon Jaskuła* was the first Pole to climb the Tour de France podium, taking 3e place in 1993.

Another great Polish rider, *Rafał Majka*, won numerous stages in the Grand Tours.



## Tour of Poland

The best-known Polish cycle race is the Tour de Pologne. It was first held in 1928 to boost sales of the *Przegląd Sportowy* newspaper with Warszawskie Towarzystwo Cyklistów, and was only opened up to professional riders in 1993. Its inclusion in the ProTour, which until then had only a modest status (category 2.2), was due to the International Cycling Union's desire to internationalise cycling. The Tour of Poland is run over 7 stages, usually at the beginning of August. This stage race has been on the UCI World Tour programme since 2005.



Unfortunately, the Tour of Poland also has its weaknesses when it comes to rider safety.

It is considered to be the most dangerous lap, with downhill finishes and certain precautions not taken.

This led to a number of tragedies, including the death of promising young Belgian climber Bjorg Lambrecht on a low stone wall.

On the other hand, Fabio Jakobsen's unbelievable crash in the downhill finish at 70km/h prompted the organisers to remedy the situation.

### The Szlakiem Walk Majora Hubala

The Szlakiem Walk Majora Hubala (literally "Walk on the road of Major Hubal") is a Polish cycling race<sup>1</sup>. It is contested in the Holy Cross and Mazovia voivodships, with a finish in Końskie. Created in 2000, it was run as a one-day race until 2006. In 2005, it became part of the UCI Europe Tour in category 1.2. In 2007, it became a stage race and was classified in category 2.2. It stopped taking place between 2011 and 2015. It reappeared in 2016 and was reintroduced to the UCI Europe Tour in 2017 in category 2.1. Cancelled in 2020, the race has not been held since. The race pays tribute to Major Henryk Dobrzański (nicknamed "Hubala").







The Tour Bałtyk-Karkonosze is a cycling race held in western Poland between the Baltic Sea and the Karkonosze. The first edition took place in 1993 as an amateur race under the name Karkonosze Tour with stages in Wałbrzych Voivodeship and Jelenia Góra Voivodeship. In 1996, the race turned professional. In 1997, it adopted the current North-South route. The race was part of the UCI Europe Tour from 2005 to 2009, switched to national event status from 2010 to 2014, before returning to the UCI Europe Tour in 2015.
